The STEAM initiative is an integrated approach to life skills and 21st century entrepreneurship training for vulnerable women and girls and survivors of Gender-Based Violence (GBV), Harmful Practices (HP) and Obstetric Fistula (OF).





The Goal of the initiative is to empower women and girls as a key strategy in ending all forms of gender-based violence and harmful practices The Initiative has empowered 24 girls and young women with skills, start-up equipment, and supplies to gainfully establish their bag-making businesses.

The STEAM, an acronym for Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) information, Technology Skills for Sales and Marketing, Ending VAWG and HP Information, Accounting and Business Management Skills and Manufacturing and Start -up Support, is a 6-month program by United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and its partners.

The flagship program is being implemented as part of the Spotlight Initiative long-term recovery intervention for survivors of gender-based violence and harmful practices.

The goal of the initiative is to empower women and girls as a key strategy in ending all forms of gender-based violence and harmful practices. The women empowerment aspect involves equipping women with information, skills, and the capacity to have control over their lives, to make decisions on issues that affect them and their family, their SRHR; education; occupying leadership positions as well as participating in governance.

Although the application process is made competitive, it follows the principle of 'Leave No One Behind' by allocating at least



to women and girls living with disability.
